We want to join the psalmist in elevating our supplication to God, particularly in these upset and severe times we are living in, which clearly reveal our structural human fragility. We do ask our Lord to enlighten our way, to indicate us where to address our way to progress towards Him.

Certainly, the psalmist knew the law, he knew all the prescriptions given by Moses, but he was also aware that enforcing Moses' law into day-by-day life is not easy nor simple. We often forget it, we often face the difficulty of connecting the God's word to our practical and daily actions.

That's why it is extremely important to address ourselves to God, ask Him counsel, the **gift of Counsel**; to ask Him to inspire us to be able to live in this world recognizing his Word and how to apply it among people and events. We can thus be able to put our faith into practice; faith indeed is a regular, daily practice.

Through our faith we continuously choose God's way, we continuously choose what can move us nearer to Him and we do not run the risk to choose what can bring us far from Him, go back or stand still.

For this, we elevate our supplication with the psalmist, in these days where we may have more time than usual: *Make known to me your ways, Lord; teach me your path. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my savior.*

The Lord of our salvation wants to save us; let us pray so as it may become a tangible reality.
